Here is a message from Pastor Chris:

The deacons and I met to discuss our reopening of indoor services here at MBC. After much prayer, thought, and consideration of all the factors, and the survey that many of you filled out, we want to give you some good news! I'm sure many of you have been waiting patiently. We understand that many churches have begun to meet back already. There are a lot of opinions about this virus. We want to let you know that this decision has not been made lightly and we have done all we can to serve all of the church family and any potential guests.

On Sunday, July 12, we will begin doing a two-service system. You will have two service choices, an outdoor service at 9:00 am and an indoor service at 11:00 am. We will continue to livestream our service (the 11:00 am one) on Facebook for those that would like to stay home safely and watch.

These two options will hopefully serve the whole body well. The 9:00am is for those that don't feel comfortable meeting inside yet. This service will also allow for congregational singing. We will also continue to allow for those that would like to stay in their cars. Keep in mind, this is weather permitting. If its not possible to meet outside because of heat or rain, we will then move that service indoors. You will have 24 hour notice of that change and you can make that decision of whether you feel comfortable meeting inside that day or would rather stay home and watch the livestream.

The 11:00am service will be indoors, very similar to what we have been doing outdoors. It will take place in the fellowship hall, as it gives us more ability to spread out and keep social distancing guidelines. A couple of things to keep in mind for indoor services: there will be no congregational singing for a while indoors. Many studies indicate group singing indoors can increase the spread of the virus. We hate to limit this, but feel it is best for this time. We will still have music performed by our musicians. Feel free to whisper, hum, and prayerfully reflect during the music. This is temporary and we will sing again as we get closer to the end of the pandemic. A second thing to keep in mind is that we will highly encourage the use of masks indoors. It is not a requirement, but strongly suggested. All that applies to the 11am service will apply to the 9am service if it gets moved inside because of weather.

We will keep doing the livestream. If you are sick or in any way do not feel comfortable meeting yet, please stay home. There is absolutely no judgment for doing so. We desire safety for you and the church family. You are not any less of a church member if you choose not to meet in person yet. We understand completely.

More information on how the indoor service will go in regards to entering, seating, and exiting is available on the church website. We hope that this gives everyone options. We ultimately leave the decision up to you and your family. We will do all we can to meet safely, if you choose to come, with social distancing and increased sanitation practices.
