As many of you know, I caught the COVID virus last month. Thankfully, it was very mild for me and it did not spread to anyone else in my family or in the church when we worshiped together that Sunday when I didn't know I had it yet. I think this speaks positively to why some of the measures that we have been doing have been helpful and needed. I am thankful for you that have been willing to roll with the punches and abide by those guidelines, whether you have chosen to be in-person or online with us throughout this time.

What I wanted to write about was one aspect of the virus that I didn't think about until I had it, and it was the isolating nature of it. I had to isolate in one room in the house and one bathroom that was connected to it. I had to do this for 10 days. I couldn't be anywhere else, and if I had to leave the room, I did it with a mask and very quickly, wiping down anything I touched. During that time, I couldn't be around my wife. I couldn't hug her, kiss her, or even be close to her. The same was the case with Lily and Riley. The only way I could see them was if they opened door, sat at the staircase that leads up to the door, and talked to me while I sat clear on the other end of the bedroom with a mask on. For 10 days. That was terrible. That first day I was able to come out, I hugged Bethany, gave her a big kiss and just enjoyed being near her. The same with the girls. I chased them around the house, tickled them, and just enjoyed being near them. And it has been so much worse for many others. Our God did not create us to be constantly isolated.

I hope this reminds us of something. We *need* presence and interaction with others. As that relates to the church, as we approach a year of having dealt with this pandemic, I want to remind you that when the time comes that we can gather as we used to more normally, when this virus has waned and those that are more at risk are able to gather in worship, that we take gathering with the church family seriously. Some may disagree with me on this, but online church cannot replace the physical gathering of believers. For now, we have to consider it as a stop-gap during this pandemic. It can even be used as a tool to introduce people to what the church is like. But when the pandemic is over, we need to emphasize that we need to be with each other, to be near our church family, to be together. That's the expectation of the member of the body of Christ. The Bible reminds us of this truth. "²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." – Hebrews 10:25 (ESV)

We need those face-to-face interactions, those handshakes, those hugs, those moments of presence with God's people. We need our Bible study groups, our Sunday School classes, our times of fellowship. We need it to grow, to encourage, and to hold each other accountable. We need the church to be equipped and on mission together to reach the world with the gospel. I pray the pandemic has taught us this one truth: we need the church.

Restarting Sunday School - March 7th 2021

Dear Church Family, It has been a long time coming, but we are finally ready to come back to Sunday School! It will look a bit different, but these will be temporary beginning steps as we move toward opening up more fully our ministries here at Macedonia Baptist. Sunday School will begin on March 7th.

The time will be from 10:10am – 10:50am, between our two worship services. Here is what it will look like:

First, our children's and youth Sunday School classes will be meeting in their normal classrooms, while encouraging safe environments as best as we can with our children. Nursery – 12th grade classes will meet in their respective rooms as they did before. Masks are encouraged as per our current guidelines, but we understand that at times there will need to be breaks and that for our very little ones it may be difficult to keep them, so we won't require masks for them to attend. We feel as though if our children and youth are able to be in classes at school, we can certainly have them in Sunday School. Please make a decision that best fits your family. Our teachers are ready and willing to teach our youth and children and we look forward to getting them back into classes, hearing the Word of God!

Second, we will not have our normal Sunday School classes just yet for adults, but instead, we will have one large adult class in the Fellowship Hall. Seats will be spread out like they were when we did worship services there last year before we moved into the sanctuary. At this moment, our classroom spaces make it impossible for us to keep social distancing guidelines. This is a starting point to get back to being part of Sunday School, and as time goes on with more vaccinations being distributed, we will update Sunday School policies and begin coming back to our regular classes in the future. Our current health guidelines we use for worship will be used for this Sunday School time in the Fellowship Hall. Your teachers will be based on a rotation schedule.

Lastly, your Sunday School books for the quarter are available on the table, located in the hallway by the water fountain in the education building (beside the nursery). Don't let the books go to waste! Please come and grab those before or after services, and if you are not able to make in-person services, please come by and pick them up during office hours or call the office if you need someone to drop yours off at your home. We would be happy to assist you in that. Though it's not just like it was before the COVID pandemic, it is a start and we are excited to start offering Sunday School again here at MBC. Anytime we can gather and learn from God's Word is a special time where God can do great things as He speaks to us through His holy Word.


